A Bit of Museum News

The Dexter Area Museum will be open during Dexter Daze only on Friday, August 14 from 1 to 3 PM. Currently the Museum features an exhibit of "Clothing Through the Ages" showing garments from the 1800's through 1970. This display has the oldest artifact from the Museum's collection, a cotton dress from 1810, which belong to Mary Laney Steinbach's grandmother, Mrs. Jones. Added to this display, will be collection of children's clothing items from the Museum's clothing. Also available will be the Museum's Gift Shop.

It's Time for Tours of Gordon Hall!

The tour date is Saturday, August 15, 2015 during Dexter Days. Drive up to the Hall where there is parking on the grounds. There is a suggested donation of \$5 for adults and children under 12 are free with an adult. Proceeds go toward the rehabilitation of Gordon Hall. We will begin tours at 12 Noon and start new ones whenever we have a few persons gathered. The last group will begin the tour at 3PM. The tour can take from 30 to 35 minutes and includes the entire house. However, the tour will take you down 1 flight of stairs to the basement and up three flights to the Attic. If the stairs are a problem, there are chairs available on the main floor where you can wait for your group.

At the end of the tour James Parker will be available to sell and sign his 2012 book, "Voices of the Past: The Saga of Gordon Hall". The book is \$25 and proceeds now go to the rehabilitation of Gordon Hall. An information booth for any questions we have not answered will also be available at the end of the tour.

Our greatest achievement was, with the help of the Fusilier matching donations, being able to pay off the mortgage on Gordon Hall on September 4, 2014. A special "Burning of the Mortgage" event was held to celebrate the occasion.

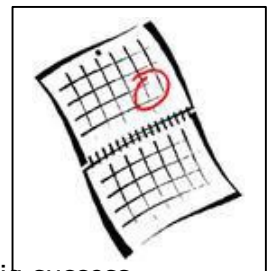
Two beautiful weddings were held in the fall. They both had sunny but cool days.

In October a movie was made at Gordon Hall, as a production company out of Detroit filmed "Swing Low". It was about two plantation owners in the 1850's in the south and their conflict over a slave. The front of Gordon Hall was used for the rich plantation owner and the back for the poorer one. It took about a week to film and several from the historical society and the community were involved in the filming. A special premier showing was held at the Encore Theatre in April.

New front sidewalks were put in place in late October.

Christmas at the Mansion, held the first week in December, was another huge success with many visitors to Gordon Hall to view the lovely decorated rooms.

The 2015 Civil War Days at Gordon Hall was the last of these events. Saturday of Civil War Days, brought many visitors to the grounds and the last fundraising dinner was a big success.



This summer, Gordon Hall will be the site of six weddings and one wedding reception.

Thanks to Bev Hill, Caryl Burke and our grant committee, we have just been awarded two grants to move forward with the restoration of Gordon Hall. The state historic preservation grant will allow us to start restoration on the outside of the Hall and the Jeffris grant will let us move forward in restoring the inside of Gordon Hall to the way it was in 1863 when Judge Dexter died.

Many thanks to Paul Bishop, Jim Wheeler, Jan Lyons, Jan Stagg and all others who help to keep Gordon Hall and its grounds looking beautiful.
