### 2015 Civil War Days Historic Room

The "Grand Army of the Republic" was a fraternal organization composed of veterans of the Union Army, Union Navy, Marines and the U. S. Revenue Cutter Service who served in the American Civil War for the Northern/Federal forces. Founded in 1866 in Decatur, Illinois, it was dissolved in 1956 when its last member died. Although a Veterans organization, the G.A.R. was instrumental in supporting voting rights for black veterans and promoting patriotic education. They helped to make Memorial Day a national holiday, were instrumental in the establishment of regular veterans' pensions, and supported Republican political candidates. The peak of its membership was in 1890 with more than 490,000 members.

The Col. H. H. Jeffords Post #330 was organized November 5, 1885 in Dexter, Michigan. Thanks to the Bates Family, we are fortunate to have at the Museum three books from the H. H. Jeffords Post: The list of Soldiers who were members, and two Secretary Books (1886-1891 and 1912-1918). These books, pictures, and some artifacts from Post #330 will be the basis for a display in the South Living

Room of Gordon Hall during the 2015 Civil War Days, which will be held on June 12th to 14th.

### Annual Membership Meeting Election
